## Inspired

As a former hospice volunteer, Mandy understood how important it is that volunteers deliver best practice, and the vital role they can play in freeing up staff time.

### **Activated**

Created a volunteer training programme for Macmillan Caring Locally to upskill volunteers in communication skills and provide end of life support.



### **Opportunity**

Volunteers were given the opportunity to enhance the support they offered to patients and their families, particularly at the bedside.



### **Awarded**

The training focused on giving the volunteers the skills and confidence to be with people at end of life. It achieved the Princess Royal Training Award in 2017.

Macmillan Caring Locally had a 40% increase of referrals with no increase in the number of paid staff, as volunteers were able to take on more responsibilities.

Mandy went on to deliver similar programmes to 5 other hospices and hospitals.
